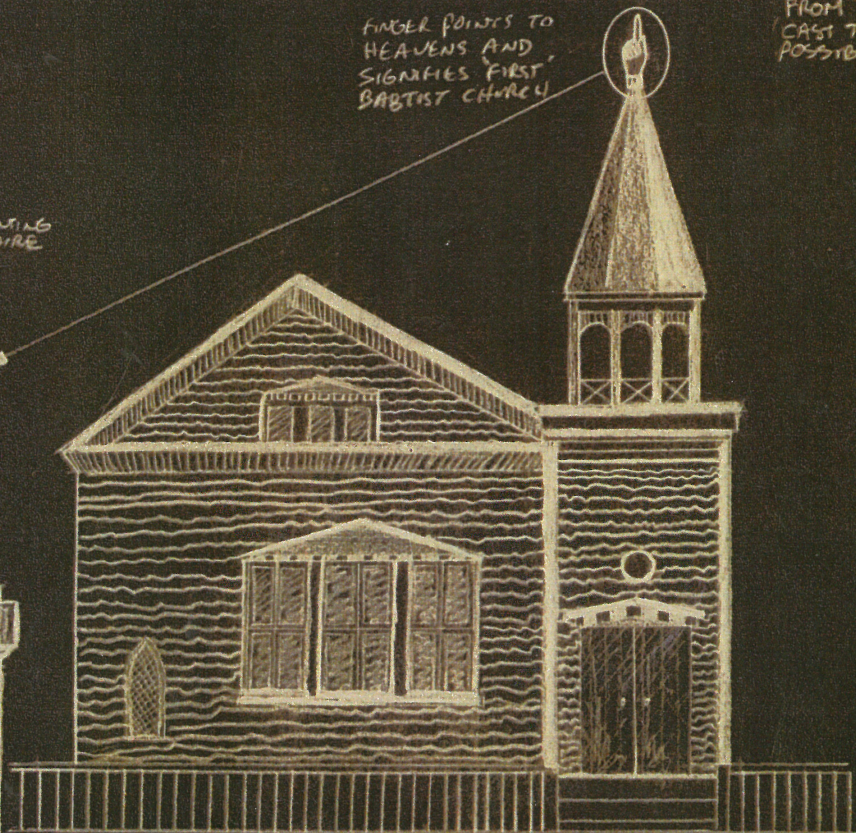

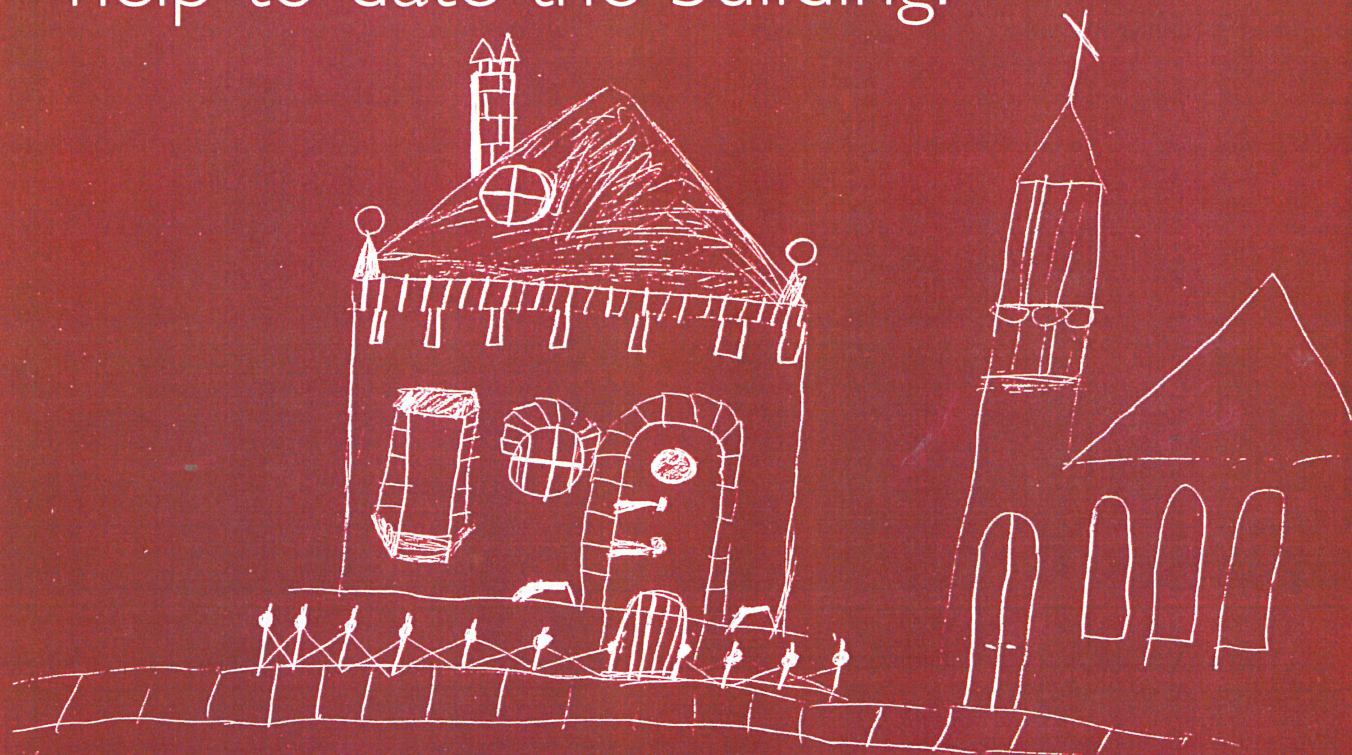

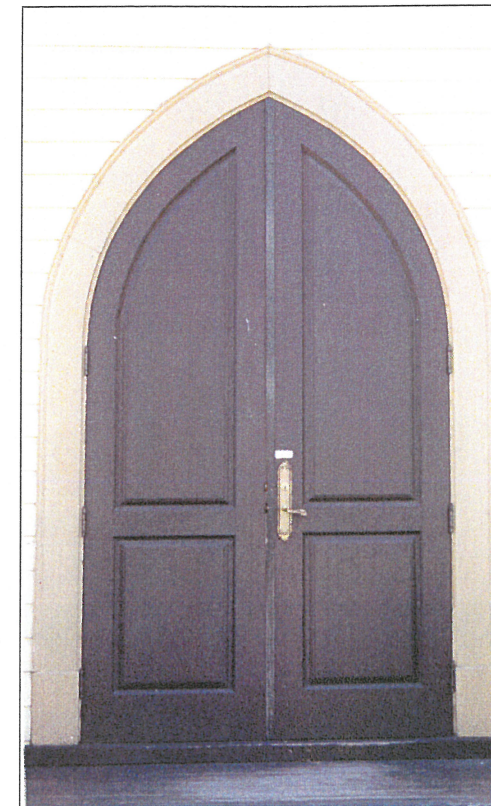
DECORATIVE ADDITIONS TO HOUSE FROM

The details—doors, windows, arches, mouldings—form a significant part of the decoration or **jewellery** of a building, and contribute to both the appearance and feeling.

As structures and fashions change over the years, these features can help to date the building.

Raised-panel double doors



Raised-panel double door

These doors have recessed panels which are surrounded by a solid wooden frame connected to the centre panel. They add elegance, depth and substantial presence to the building.

Dentil moulding

These small decorative rectangular blocks look like a row of teeth and are usually under the bed moulding.

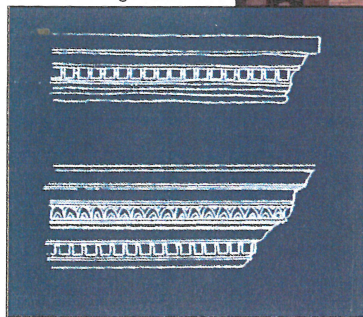


Sandwich moulding

These acute angled mouldings have a sharp projection and an angle of less than ninety degrees on the top. As if making a sandwich, an egg and dart (classic) moulding is added under the dentil.

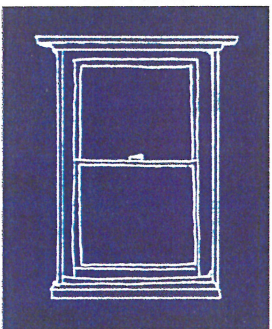

Double-hung window

On this classic window, the sash is the outer frame which holds the glass. The upper half of a double-hung window can slide down, and the bottom half can slide up.

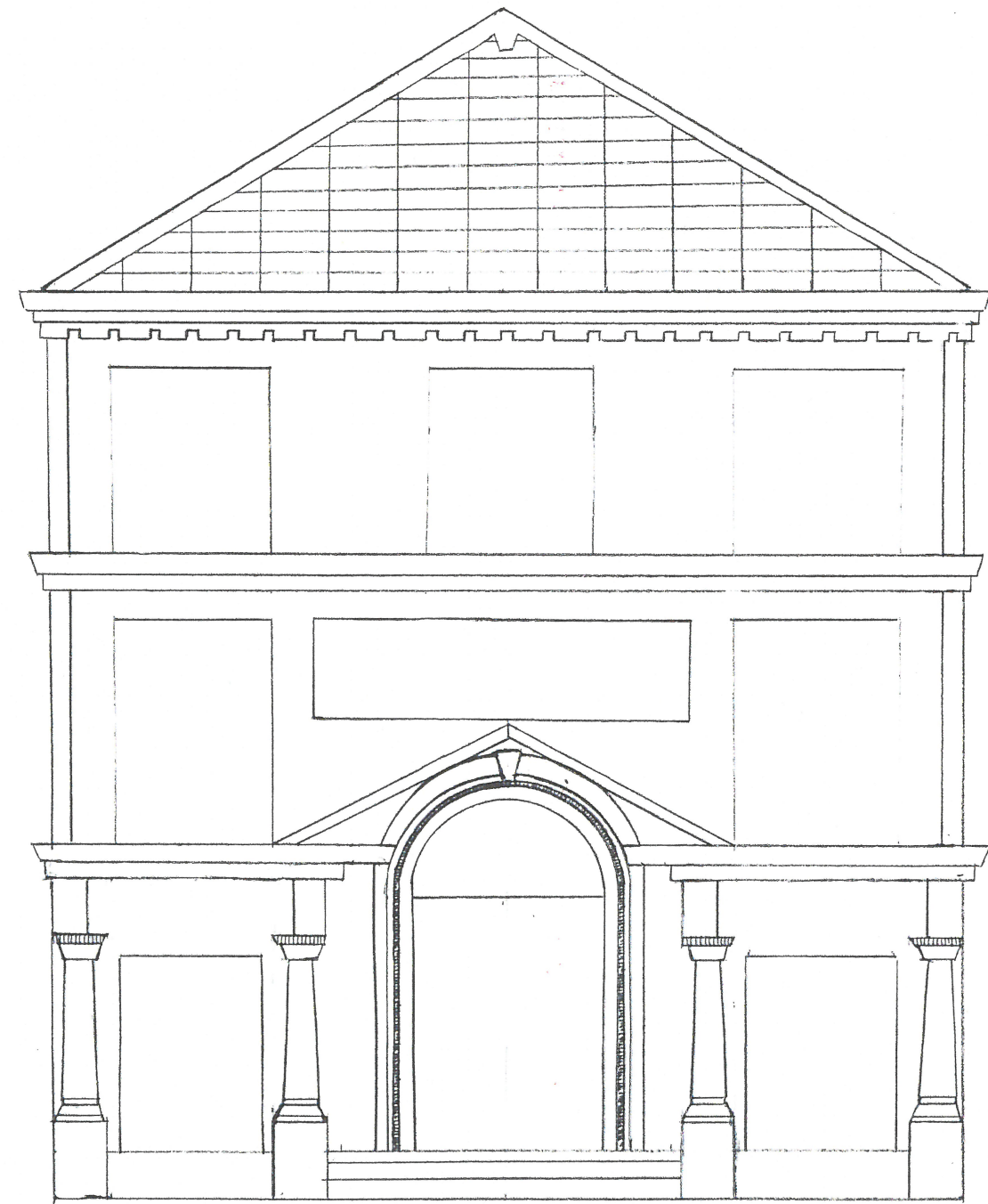

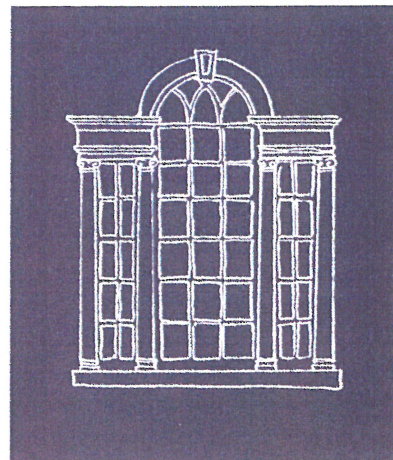

Palladian window

These windows have strong proportions, and extend the full height of a cathedral ceiling.

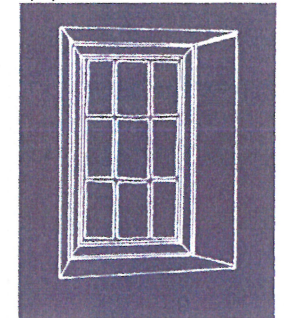

Splayed reveal

This window frame is set into a thick wall with extended angles, allowing a ledge. The outward angle creates a wider illusion.

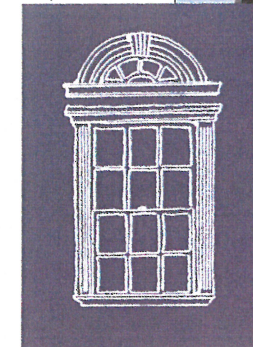

Newel post

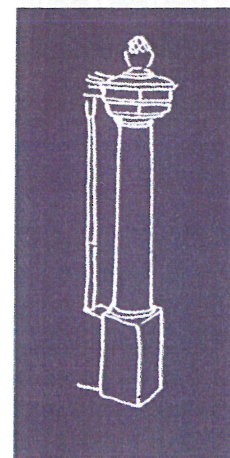
These posts are prominently placed at the bottom of a staircase. Often called a “starting” newel or “angular” newel, they are usually set on the first or second step which is generally wider than the other steps. Newel posts add substance and grace to the staircase and to the surrounding space.

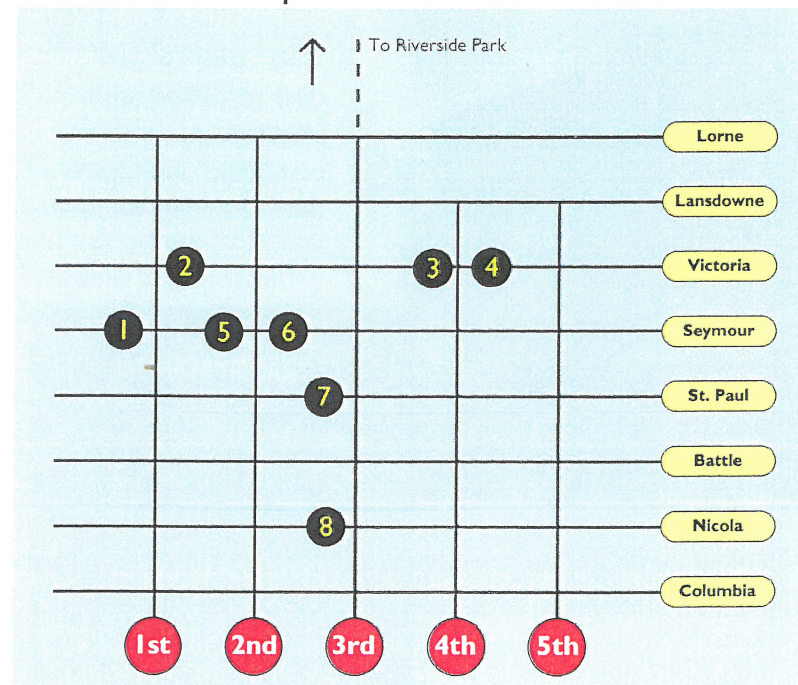
