

## INTRODUCTION TO THE SECOND ISSUE OF B.C. PERSPECTIVES

The papers included in this issue were presented at the Cariboo College History Symposium held in Kamloops on October 6th and 7th, 1972. The theme of the Symposium was " Approaches to Local/Regional History ".
