

Organizing a S.A.G.E. Presentation For Your School:

1) Choose one student and one teacher to be your school's representatives. Call Lissa Millar at 376-1550 to confirm your participation. These school representatives will serve as contacts for the Kamloops-Shuswap Peace Council, and for S.A.G.E., who may request your impressions of the presentation and follow-up as to the long term effects of the Youth Nuclear Disarmament Tour.

2) Determine if preference for morning or afternoon presentation, inform Peace Council. Schedule presentation, allowing a minimum of 2 hours. Each school will be scheduled for a full morning or afternoon with S.A.G.E. on Thursday, April 16, 1987. If your school has a preference, let us know as soon as possible so we can accomodate you.

3) Find out how many classes will be attending, and choose a suitable location, keeping in mind seating and that the room must be dark enough to view a film.

Anyone wishing to meet with S.A.G.E. in a smaller group or classroom situation may be able to book time if we know in advance.

S.A.G.E.'s priorities are to reach as many students as possible, in the most meaningful way possible, with allowances for the maximum participation of each individual student. For this reason, we encourage schools to get as many students as possible involved. S.A.G.E. also stresses that their presentation is meant to reach the full range of grades at the Junior and Senior Secondary level.

Generally, S.A.G.E. follows the following format: Introduction; Viewing of half-hour long film; 45 min. to an hour of discussion/question and answer period; Closing remarks. This format works well in an auditorium, as long as there are microphones for the question period and the room is dark enough to permit viewing the film.

4) Arrange for seating to be in place on the day of the presentation, as well as a projector and operator, and microphones for the question period.

5) Honorarium- S.A.G.E. requests an honorarium of \$125 from each school. If your school or student council cannot supply an honorarium, perhaps some kind of fund-raising might be undertaken.

6) Obtain permission for S.A.G.E. to sell t-shirts and buttons after their presentation. They request 30 min. for this, and need a place to display their wares.

5) Publicize the event around the school. The Peace Council will be informing the media, but students at your school should be fully aware of S.A.G.E.'s impending visit. Also, remind students to have money on hand- they may be surprised how much they want a t-shirt, after hearing what Max, Dez, Alison and Seth have to say. T-shirts are \$7, pins are 50 cents and \$1.

6) Inform interested parties that S.A.G.E. will be holding a meeting for students wishing to form their own peace group on the afternoon of April 17th, to be followed by a coffee house on that evening. It is unfortunate that we were scheduled to have S.A.G.E. for only one school day and one holiday (Good Friday), but we've got to take advantage of them while they're here. We'll leave lots of time for socializing on Friday night, and intend to find out what Alison, Desi, Seth and Max like in the way of music so we can make them feel at home.

We encourage students who have a commitment to working for peace to participate in S.A.G.E.'s meeting on April 17th. This is a good chance to become part of the growing network of students actively working for disarmament. You'll be surprised at how powerful you can be.
