Dear Educator;

This spring, The Kamloops-Shuswap Peace Council have the pleasure of offering a unique opportunity to the Sr. Secondary students of Kamloops. On April 15, 1987, four vibrant young people from Quebec will arrive in our city to talk with students about peace. They are members of a group called "Students Against Global Extermination", or S.A.G.E. Since September, 1986, the Youth Nuclear Disarmament Tour has been received warmly across Canada by enthusiastic students and educators, as well as by the press.

S.A.G.E. will be available to speak in each of the four Sr. Secondary schools in Kamloops on April 16th. Generally, their presentations include the showing of a film, followed by a discussion period. In addition, S.A.G.E. would like permission to sell t-shirts and buttons after the presentation. Each school is also requested to pay a \$125 honorarium to the tour.

In order to organize the presentation schedule, we would like each school to appoint a teacher and a student to serve as contacts. Please find enclosed a summary of what organization will be needed to bring S.A.G.E. to your school, as well as an assortment of information about the tour. In addition, the students from S.A.G.E. will be in Kamloops for April 17, and would like to engage in some sort of recreational activity, such as a social, sports event, or dance. If your school would like to host or participate, please let us know.

Increasingly, we hear about the fears young people feel when they consider the nuclear threat. We feel we would be remiss if we did not give the students of Kamloops a chance to hear S.A.G.E. and consider their alternatives.
