The following individuals, representing a cross section of alumni and faculty alumni from many different programs offered over the years, are the members of our board.



PROFILE ... Karl De Bruijn

Educator & Environmentalist

Karl De Bruijn, (Cariboo College alumnus '74) may not be a militant environmentalist but, make no mistake about it, he is devoted to the preservation of foliage and fauna.

Seventeen years ago, when DeBruijn attended Cariboo College, his interest in ecology was sparked by an enthusiastic geography instructor. He carried that interest through to his Physical Geography studies at Simon Fraser University, his teaching and vice-principal days in Kamloops and into his present position as principal of the McQueen Lake Centre; teaching students to appreciate nature.

Four years ago he took over operation of the centre, established as an area of land to be used as an ecological teaching aid, diverse in its make-up and easily accessible. "The McQueen Lake Environmental Education Centre is a progressive program and it has had the greatest longevity of any centre of its kind," he said. The centre opened in 1970, at the time of the environmental awareness push, and is one of the only centres of its kind still in existence.


As one of only two staff members at McQueen Lake, DeBruijn wears many hats. He not only educates students before their field trip to the centre, but also works with teachers to develop a program unique to each class, and teaches students onsight about life cycles, food chains, foliage and forestry. "The dynamic environment is a living textbook," he said. "It can't be beat as a learning tool."

As the popularity of the centre grows, in large part to DeBruijn's commitment, more and more students are offered the privelege of learning about B.C.'s ecosystems and about how to treat the environment. "Over 6,000 kids visited (the centre) last year and there's not one piece of garbage to be seen," said DeBruijn.

The centre also has an active international clientel, attracting students from as far as Japan, Spain, Europe and the United States. DeBruijn sees Europeans especially as needing a haven from the overdeveloped bastion of virulent pollution. "In many cases, all they want is to see a bear. The wilderness attracts them because it's almost impossible for them to experience wilderness at home."

DeBruijn is continuously looking for individuals who have "environmental jobs" so as to draw on their expertise. "The centre depends on it. Experts from the Ministry of Forest and Environment, Ducks Unlimited, and the Cattleman's Association all come to share their wealth of information. I want the students to know the science of how ecology works so that when they're in decision making positions, they won't be making them out of ignorance."

Despite the grim reality of today's environmental situation, DeBruijn remains optimistic. He would like to see the centre continue to "help students develop an appreciation and respect for the environment" so they can act out of knowledge instead of following time-honored ways of acting out.

The Cariboo College VISA Card A Chance to Show Alumni Pride

Cariboo College is the first educational institution in Canada to launch a Royal Bank VISA "affinity card". An affinity card provides all the benefits and advantages of a traditional VISA card, as well as functioning as a fundraiser for the non-profit society, in this case, the Cariboo College Foundation. The Royal Bank of Canada, Cariboo College and cardholder all benefit from this unique partnership arrangement.

The Cariboo College VISA card features a full color photo of the Clocktower building and College grounds, making it visually appealing and distinctive for its users.

The card has all the buying power of other internationally accepted bank cards.

The Cariboo College VISA is available to all credit worthy applicants. To obtain a Cariboo College VISA, it's not necessary to have an existing Royal Bank accountor VISA and other bank cards do not have to be surrendered. Many affinity card holders choose to carry both the Cariboo College

VISA and their current credit cards. Cariboo College Foundation projects over 5,000 individuals in our region will be Cariboo College VISA users within two years.

Revenues generated will be used by the Foundation to provide financial aid to students and to support various college projects and programs. The source of all this "revenue" is the Royal Bank.

Each time the affinity card is issued, used or renewed, the Royal Bank will pay a promotional fee to the College Foundation from its normal administration charges. The Cariboo College VISA

has no extra or hidden costs for either the cardholder or the merchant.

An additional benefit for the students is a planned course in Personal Financial Management. The complimentary course, to be taught by the Royal Bank staff, will help students learn the proper use of consumer credit.

Banks participate in affinity card agreements to expand their market of credit card clients and to gain the opportunity to demonstrate their services.



All applicants deal with the Royal Bank VISA CENTRE with complete confidentiality. Cariboo College has no access to any financial information, and no input into who qualifies.

The mandate of the Foundation is to help students gain access to excellent education. Through revenues generated by the new affinity card, more students will enjoy the benefits of post-secondary education in the years ahead.




