The Office of Institutional Research and Evaluation, with the publication of this Fact Book, attempts to present concise information to the College community and to those interested in Cariboo College.

The Fact Book is a combination of tables and charts designed to achieve readability. Historical summaries and current records (as of Fall term 1989) of student enrolment data are presented so that readers can have a better understanding of the College's history of student recruitment and its current performance in enrolment. Much of the data contained in this Fact Book was generated by and through the reports which Cariboo College is required to supply to the British Columbia Ministry of Advanced Education, Training and Technology. Each table in the Fact Book indicates the source of the data used to compile the table. Similarly, sources of data are also indicated in all charts. In most cases, the data are as good as the sources. Some data illustrated in the tables are derived from the data sources through calculations performed by the Office of Institutional Research and Evaluation. Assembly of the data and material presented in this Fact Book involved many judgements as to inclusion, exclusion and formats of presentation. STATISTICAL HIGHLIGHTS

- Total head count enrolment of 1989/90 increased by 15.7% to 4,775 as compared to 1988/89 enrolment of 4,125
- We University Transfer Program enrolment increased by 23% to 1,731 as compared to 1,411 of 1988/89 enrolment
- Total enrolment in Career/Technical Programs in 1989/90 decreased by 6.6% to 957 from 1,025 in 1988/89 enrolment
- 37.9% of the students in 1989/90 enrolled in University Transfer Program while 20% enrolled in Career/Technical Programs and 23.4% in Vocational/Trades Program
- 60.3% of the students who enrolled for the first time in 1989/90 on a full-time basis came from the Cariboo region
- The average course load per student in 1989/90 was 3.2 courses with 54.2% of the students taking 1 to 3 courses and 25% taking 5 to 6 courses
- ₹ 73.6% of the students in University Transfer Program and 63.9% in Career/Technical Programs were under 25 years old
- Among the students enrolling in non-vocational programs in 1989/90, 40% were male (1,407) and 60% female (2,107)
- Of all 1989/90 first-time full-time students 57% were attending secondary schools in B.C. during the previous year and 15% were in B.C. labor force
- As of April, 1990, there were 297 faculty members in Kamloops and 28 in Williams Lake
- Were 65% of the faculty were male and 34 faculty members had been employed at Cariboo College for 10 years or more
- ** 17% of the full-time on-going faculty members held doctoral degrees while 31% had master's degrees and 23% bachelor's degrees








CHANGES IN HEAD COUNT EMPORMENT As Compared to the Previous Year (Lart-time Vestional Not Included)



GENDER DISTRIBUTIONS IN ENROLMENT Non-Vocational Programs: 1985 - 1989






ENROLMENT IN UNIVERSITY TRANSFER: 1989





First Year Entrants




Total Enrolment by Level: Second Year






ENROLMENT BY PROGRAM AND STATUS: 1989 Changes as Compared to Fall 1988



ENROLMENT BY PROGRAM AND STATUS: 1989 Changes as Compared to Fall 1963




TOTAL HEAD COUNT ENROLMENTS BY STATUS As of Fall 1988 and Fall 1989





CHANGES IN TOTAL ENROLMENTS: FALL 1989 As Compared to Enrolments of Fall 1988




TOTAL HEAD COUNT ENROLMENTS BY STATUS As of Fall 1982 and Fall 1989



CHANGES IN TOTAL ENROLMENTS: TALL 1989 As Compared to Enrolments of Fall 1988






ENROLMENTS BY PROGRAM & STATUS:FALL 1989



FULL-TIME FIRST YEAR ENROLMENT BY AGE Fall 1989




PART-TIME FIRST YEAR ENROLMENT BY AGE Fall 1989









Full-time First Year by Age Group: 1989




ENROLMENT IN COLLEGE PREPARATORY PROGRAM FALL 1989




ENROLMENT IN COLLEGE PREPARATORY PROGRAM BY GENDER & STATUS: FALL 1989









FIRST TIME FULL-TIME BY REGION: 1989 Entrants Left School Prior to 1989






FIRST TIME FULL-TIME BY RECION: 1989 Entrants Left School Prior to 1989






ENROLMENTS IN NUMBER OF COURSES: 1989 University Transfer, Career/Technology and College Preparatory Programs




