Head Count Enrolments & Survival Rates

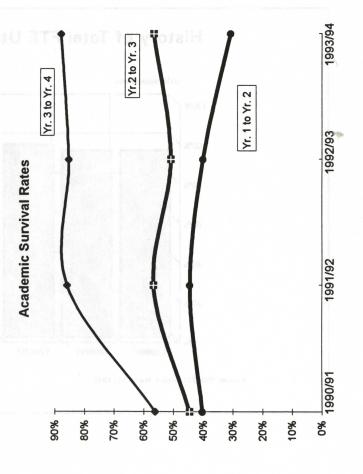

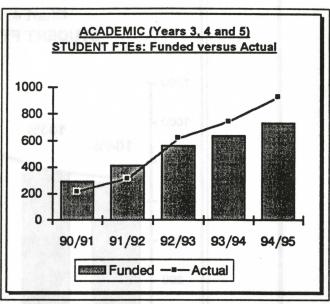




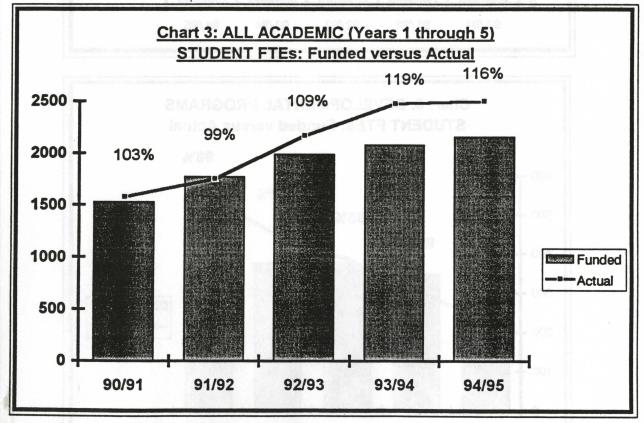
CARIBOO ACADEMIC FTES HISTORICAL ANALYSIS



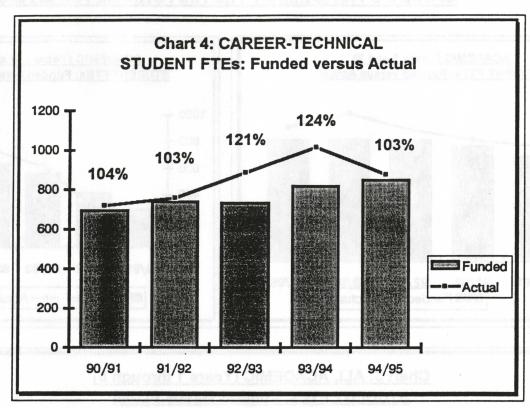

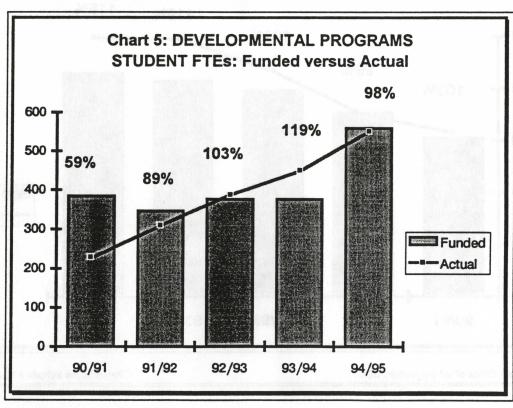


Percentages indicate FTE funded vs. actual utilization.



CAREER-TECHNICAL AND DEVELOPMENTAL FTEs HISTORICAL ANALYSIS

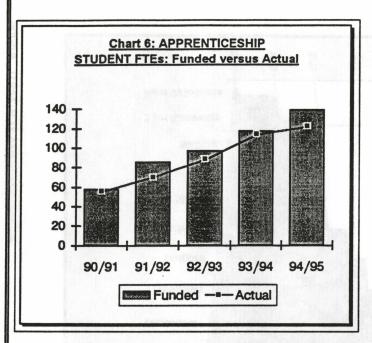


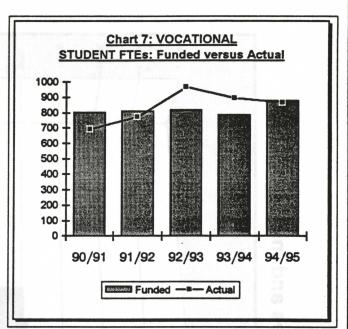


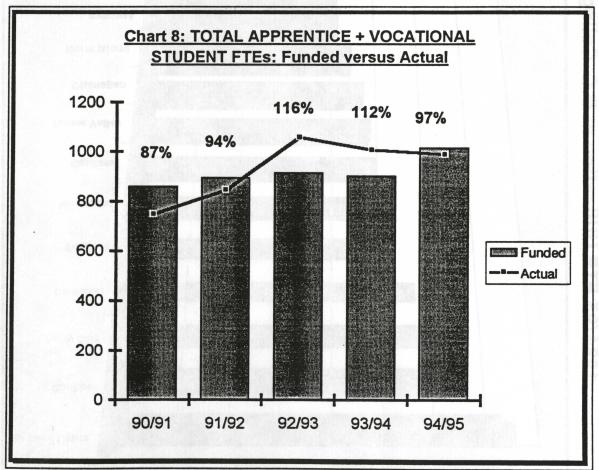

APPRENTICESHIP AND VOCATIONAL FTES HISTORICAL ANALYSIS

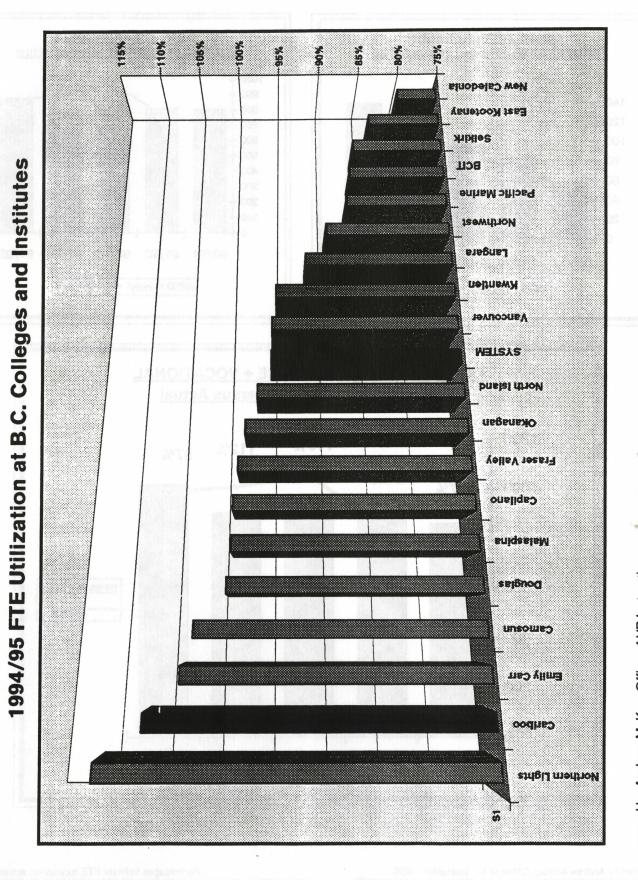

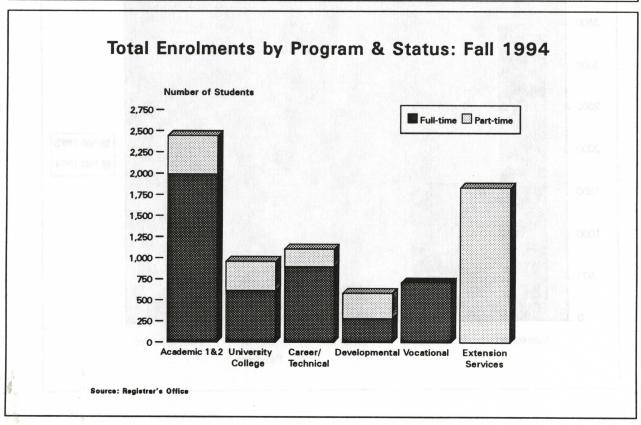

Percentage of Genders in Non-Vocational Programs Over the Past 10 Years

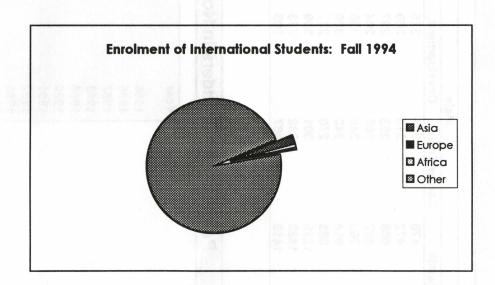

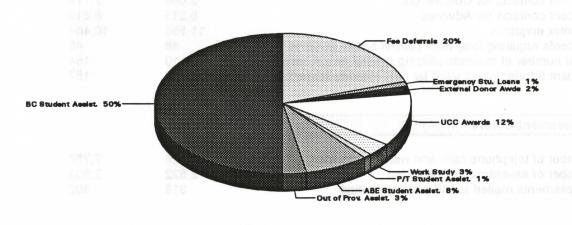

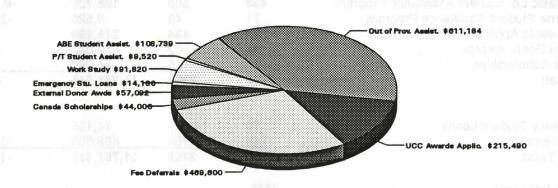
Financial Aid & Awards

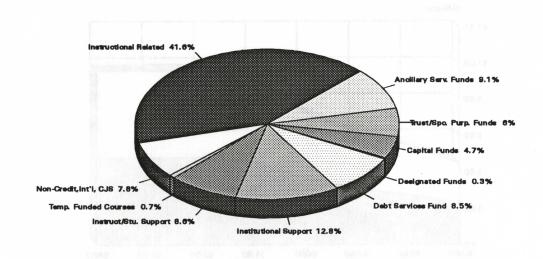
Fiscal Year 1994/95 Revenue

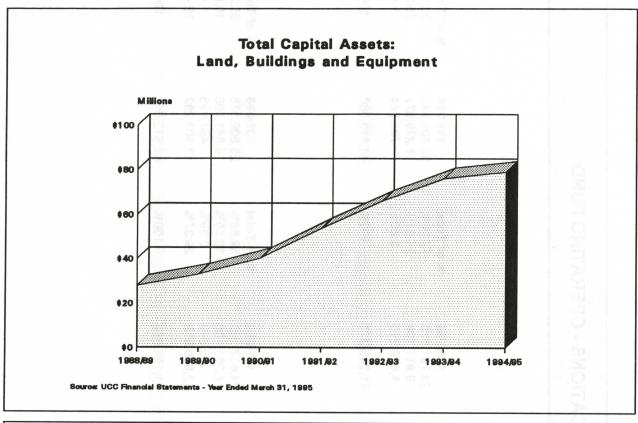
