



AGE / GENDER DISTRIBUTIONS: ACADEMIC PROGRAMS, FALL 1998


Full-time Age Distribution




Full-time Gender Distribution




Total Academic Gender Distribution






Full-time Age Distribution




Full-time Gender Distribution




Total Career/Technical Gender Distribution






Full-time Age Distribution




Full-time Gender Distribution




Student Development Total Gender Distribution
