twenty years ago

Established in 1970, Cariboo came into being as the result of a merger between the Society seeking to establish the college, and the planned Kamloops Vocational school then under construction on this site. The first year of operation was at the Kamloops Indian Residential School, while the 'Main' building was expanded to house both trades and the academic programs that would together make up the new College.

The College officially moved to its present location in 1971, where the Main Building and Cafeteria were surrounded by sand and sagebrush. The library was added in 1975, and at the end of the decade both the Science building and Gymnasium were built. It was another nine years before the next major growth, with the addition of a classroom block to the second floor of the Main building, and the opening of the Clocktower Building and Theatre in 1989.

economic partner

Cariboo is committed to supporting economic development in Kamloops and across the region. From the private sector McGill Student Housing development, the Cariboo Management Centre, and the Computer Access Centre in downtown Kamloops to co-operative education, technology transfer research projects, and the delivery of programs across the region, College people are working in support of the regional economy.

With over 700 fulltime and parttime employees and an annual operating budget of nearly \$30 million, the direct economic impact is significant. On campus, classrooms and athletic facilities are used by local community groups, the library is open to all residents, and the Dining Room, operated by the food training program, has a reputation of being second to none.

Cariboo is a regional institution, serving 60,000 square miles in B.C.'s interior. Beyond the main campus in Kamloops, facilities include a smaller campus in Williams Lake, Learning Centres in Merritt and 100 Mile House, and a network of community coordinators across the region.

campus

The 250-acre main campus is located on the south slope of Kamloops, overlooking the junction of the North and South Thompson rivers. While less than 100 acres is currently developed, a long-range campus plan will ensure future growth that is both functional and in keeping with the natural beauty of the area. Going back over 50 years, the campus was home to the Canadian Navy during WW2, as the site of the navy's ammunition and torpedo storage dumps. The small green and white 'houses' along the western edge of the campus, still in use today, were officer's quarters on the base during this time. As the campus grows there will be new 'people oriented' plazas of green grass and flowers to compliment the beautiful landscaping, designed and developed by the College's own horticulture program.

looking ahead

University-college status and the opportunity to complete university degrees in Kamloops has created a new alternative for many students in the interior. The response has been substantial enrolment increases every, year since 1988, and the College has set an objective of attaining fully independent university status by 1995.

Cariboo has seen tremendous change as the result of degree programs and there's more to come. Over \$14 million in expansions to the Library and Science buildings, and the construction of a new Arts and Education classroom building, to be completed in 1991, will provide enough space to meet current demands.






