

THE RIVER ACTING ENDOWMENT AWARD

THE UCC ACTORS WORKSHOP THEATRE

The UCC Actors Workshop celebrates its tenth anniversary of producing live stage plays for the Kamloops community with UP THE IVORY TOWER, by Joseph Robinette. The play takes a satiric look at life at a typical, contemporary university and focuses on the career of first-year Professor Dr. John McBride. A sometimes serious, often humorous collage of contemporary college life, UP THE IVORY TOWER explores the relationships among Administration, Faculty and Students who interact in a variety of familiar situations.

The workshop format is primarily designed as an actor's theatre. The main focus of our productions is on the representative skills of the actors who bring to life the various characters portrayed. It is important to remember that the primary goal of educational theatre is to provide practical opportunities for theatre students to practise their craft. Consequently, the actors you see tonight were active participants in the creative process of character portrayal and development.

Frequent patrons of our program's previous productions during the past nine years will no doubt notice the realistic technical aspects of UP THE IVORY TOWER. This is due to the College's inclusion of Technical Theatre as part of the growing Theatre program at UCC. All of the technical elements of UP THE IVORY TOWER are designed and produced by instructor Jamie Toth and the students of the College's Theatre 112 class.
