

Now in its twelfth year of producing live stage dramatic performances, the UCC ACTORS WORKSHOP THEATRE is proud to present Michael Cristofer's, THE SHADOW BOX. This Tony Award and Pulitzer Prize winning play is a sensitive and probing exploration of the true meaning of living.

In separate cottages on a hospital's grounds dwell three terminally ill cancer patients: Joe, Brian and Felicity. With them are the significant people in their lives. Joe's wife Maggie and his son Steven, Brian's former wife Beverly and his new interest Mark, and Felicity's daughter Agnes.

The play is about their anxieties and their coming to grips with the finality of their "medical condition"—a preordained future whose only imponderable is its exact length. But THE SHADOW BOX is not about dying. Rather it is a play that deals with our fears and with the complex relationship between human mortality and what it means to be truly alive. Hold on tight! You are in for a highly emotional ride that is sometimes surprisingly funny, often disturbing and always quite moving.

THE UCC ACTORS WORKSHOP is primarily designed to enhance the educational environment of our Theatre students by providing them with opportunities to explore their craft in front of the viewing public. The actors in this production come from UCC's second, third and fourth year Theatre program, and technical assistance is provided by students in the Technical Theatre class.
