I have been authorized to make the announcement that the Cariboo Regional College will commence operation next September in the facilities provided at the Kamloops Indian Residential School.

On behalf of the College Council I wish to thank the Kamloops Indian Band for its wonderful cooperation in this matter. The Band's offer has been very generous and they have also agreed to provide parking facilities very close to the College buildings.

It can now be said that the College will definitely be a day-time operation with some classes being provided in the evening for those who, by reason of work or other obligations, are unable to attend the day sessions.

The College library will be open during the day and evenings and on Saturdays and Sundays so that students may obtain maximum use of this facility.

The agreement with the Indian Band is on a year-to-year basis so that the College will be able to move either into or alongside the incoming Vocational School which, of course, will become part of the College operation.

There will be no dormitory facilities on the campus, but the College is compiling a list of private boarding facilities which will assist students in securing accommodation.

Information on the College technical programs will be available to the public and the schools in a very short time.

I would like to advise the public that our present office, located at 465 Victoria Street, above Syd Smith Motors, will remain open and we invite your inquiries to be made at this location and not at the Indian School.
