Some important questions and answers:

- Q. Have our academic courses university transferability?
 - A. Yes. Our three universities have granted transferability provided the student's work reaches satisfactory standards.
- 2. Q. Are our standards adequate?
 - A. Yes. Our faculty maintains courses at a high standard.
- 3. Q. Is our faculty adequately qualified?
 - A. Yes. All faculty members are fully qualified and acceptable by the universities.
- 11. Q. Do we offer programs other than academic?
 - A. Yes. We offer a variety of technology and career programs now. We will offer more next September.
- 5. Q. How big are the classes?
 - A. They do not exceed 40 students.
- 6. Q. Are students able to participate in college life?
 - A. Yes. They participate in various levels of College government and have many sports and social activities.
- 7. Q. Are courses also transferable to the B.C. Institute of Technology?
 - A. Yes. When student achievement satisfies Cariboo College, the student will be accepted by B.C.I.T.
- 8. Q. Are the fees high?
 - They are much lower than those charged by a university. At Cariboo College the fees are \$125 per semester.
- 9. Q. What about employment opportunities?
 - Students who are not trained will have great difficulty finding A. jobs, so continue specific training.
- 10. Q. What are the employment opportunities if I enrol in an Arts Program?
 - You must plan further specialized training in some profession A. after obtaining the Arts Degree.
- Q. What are the employment opportunities if I enrol in a technology program? 11.
 - Last year B.C.I.T. place 94 per cent of its graduates in jobs. A.
- 12. Q. Why not go straight to B.C.I.T.?
 - Except in certain cases you do not need to. Cariboo College can supply technology training in the first year and you can be reasonably sure of a seat in second year courses at B.C.I.T. despite overcrowding in the latter institution.
- Q. Are adults able to enrol in the College? 13.
 - A. Yes. They certainly can, and should take advantage of the Mature Student regulations.
- Q. Are entry standards at Cariboo College the same as at the universities? 14.
 - A. No. Cariboo College will let you enter with a 50% mark.

- 15. Q. Must I take a full program?

 A. You may take a full program, or a part-time program of one or more subjects in either academic, careers or technology.
- 16. Q. Can associations, or groups, ask the College to provide courses for them?

 A. The College urges any association, or group, to request the College to provide training or facilities.
- 17. Q. Are pre-College courses provided?

 A. Yes. Introductory programs are provided, and you may be able to take one or two College level courses simultaneously.
- 18. Q. What courses will be offered in the incoming Vocational School?

 A. The College will inform you as soon as definite information is provided by the Government.
- 19. Q. Are courses offered in the evenings?
 A. Yes. A constantly expanding night program is available.
