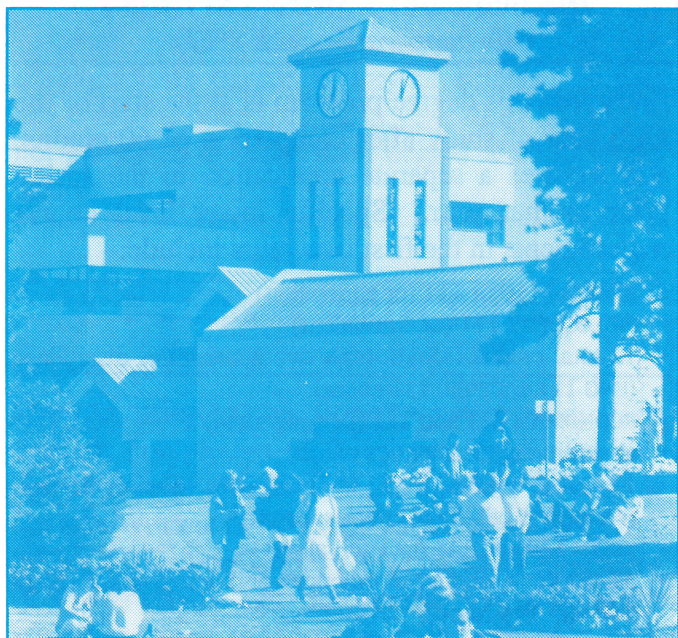

University Degree Programs—1991

General Information for College and High School Students

University entrance

At Cariboo, students can begin first year university studies and later choose between transferring to a provincial University or staying to complete a full degree program. Specific transfer programs at Cariboo include: Arts, Science, Engineering, Forestry (UBC), Commerce, plus one or more years of a number of various professional degree areas. In all cases, students should consult the calendar of the University to which they intend to transfer for details of courses they will REQUIRE, and then consult with the Chairperson of the program area or an academic advisor at the College counselling office, to plan course selections and requirements in advance.



Complete degree programs in Kamloops

As a designated university-college, Cariboo now offers students the opportunity to complete all four or five years of specific degrees at the Kamloops campus.

In each case, students receive their degree in the name of the University it originates from (eg. students who complete an Arts degree at Cariboo will be awarded their Bachelor of Arts degree from the University of British Columbia).

There are now SIX Degrees offered at Cariboo:

- Bachelor of ARTS (General)
(from UBC)
- Bachelor of SCIENCE (Majors or General)
(from UBC)
- Bachelor of BUSINESS STUDIES
(from SFU)
- Bachelor of EDUCATION - Elementary
(from UBC)
- Bachelor of SOCIAL WORK
(from UVIC)
- Bachelor of Science in NURSING
(from UVIC)

Future degree programs that may be available include

- Bachelor of EDUCATION - Secondary
(from UBC)

This degree program is NOT YET offered, but interested students should plan to complete the required first degree in another area of study.

Students entering first or second year academic study should know that:

1. Entry into the "degree program" does not usually happen until the second, third or fourth year of study (see each individual degree for more information) and requires a separate application at that time. Degree program applications will generally be evaluated on the basis of marks and completion of the "required" lower level courses.

2. To begin work towards a degree, apply for admission to Cariboo in the Academic program, and select courses needed to meet lower level requirements of the intended degree. Students will be asked to identify the degree program they intend to pursue, and should arrange to meet with either an academic advisor in the counselling office, or the degree program advisor available for each degree, to ensure they are fully aware of the lower level courses they **MUST** complete in order to be **ELIGIBLE TO APPLY** for entry into their degree program.

Bachelor of ARTS: (in cooperation with UBC)

Entry into this degree program is at the start of the third year of study (or after successful completion of at least 48 credits) and requires a separate application in the spring prior to that year. Specific lower level course requirements for students planning to complete the B.A. degree include:

ENGLISH: two of Cariboo 110, 111 or 121 (or equivalent)
LANGUAGE: with French 12 - no further requirement
with French 11 - 6 credits of study MIN.
SCIENCE: 6 credits of study minimum.
LITERATURE: 6 credits of English Literature, usually at 200 level.

Bachelor of SCIENCE (in cooperation with UBC)

Entry into this degree program is at the start of the third year of study (or after successful completion of at least 48 credits) and requires a separate application in the spring prior to that year. Specific lower level course requirements for students planning to complete the B.Sc. degree include:

- any two of Cariboo ENGLISH 110, 111 or 121 (or equivalent)
- six credits of 100-level CHEMISTRY
- six credits of 100-level PHYSICS
- six credits of 100-level MATH (Calculus)
- six credits of additional 100-level study in other areas of SCIENCE
- MINIMUM total of 32 credits of 100 and 200 level study in SCIENCES, MATH and COMPUTING
- six credits of Arts electives, over and above English requirement

MAJORS: Starting in September 1991, students may be able to complete a MAJOR in the BSc. degree in one or more of these subject areas:

- Biology
- Animal Biology
- Chemistry
- Mathematics
- Physics

Contact the Degree Program Advisor for details and confirmation. These are SUBJECT to FINAL BUDGET approval.

Bachelor of BUSINESS STUDIES (in cooperation with SFU)

Entry into this degree program is at the start of the third year of study after completion of 60 credits, and requires a separate application in the spring prior to that year. Specific lower level course requirements in the first two years include:

- ENGLISH 110 or 111 (or equivalent)
- PHILOSOPHY 111 (or equivalent)
- 12 total credits from at least two Humanities disciplines (ENG 111 and PHIL 111 count)
- ECONOMICS 211 and 221 (or equivalent)
- an additional ECONOMICS course
- 12 total credits from at least two Social Science disciplines (all ECON courses count)
- MATH 140 and 141 (or equivalent)
- Minimum 6 credits in Sciences or Math courses (Math 140 and 141 count)
- COMMERCE 221 (or equivalent)
- BUSINESS STUDIES 232 and 237 (or equivalent)
- additional 20 credits elective study for MINIMUM total of 50 credits outside of BUSINESS STUDIES and COMMERCE

Bachelor of EDUCATION - Elementary (in cooperation with UBC)

Entry into this degree program is NOT available until at least the start of the fourth year of study, after completing a minimum of 90 credits of university course work, generally in either arts or science. Specific lower level courses required will include:

- any two of Cariboo ENGLISH 110, 111 or 121 (or equivalent)
- 3 credits MINIMUM and 6 credits preferred in each of:
 - a lab science
 - mathematics
 - geography or history
- at least 18 credits of UPPER level (300-400) course work in ONE subject area included in B.C. elementary school curriculum

First year students may declare their intentions for the Education degree when they apply, or may initially follow an Arts or Science degree program in lower level work. However, students need to be aware of the course requirements in lower level and third year study if they intend to apply for entry into the Elementary education degree program.

Recommendation to Students: While application can be made to this degree after completion of 90 credits, not all applicants may be successful the first time. It is recommended that students work towards completion of an undergraduate degree in arts or science, so that this option is open for fourth year study if entry is not gained to the education degree after the third year.

Bachelor of SOCIAL WORK (in cooperation with UVIC)

Entry is prior to the second year of study, and requires completion of 30 credits of University work (or equivalent credit, including a Human Service Worker Certificate) with a minimum GPA of 2.33 (Cariboo College). A personal statement of career goals and objectives, and a personal interview prior to admission are also required. First year students can enter academic studies in arts or science to complete pre-program

requirements for entry in the second year. Prerequisite courses include:

- 3 credits - academic ENGLISH Composition
- Social Work 200A and 200B (or equivalent)

Students who have completed two years (60 credits) of lower level academic study may be considered for admission directly into the THIRD year of the BSW degree. The above prerequisite courses would still be required. Any interested student considering this option should contact the Associate Dean, BSW program as soon as possible. DEADLINE FOR APPLICATION to the BSW Degree is February 28, 1991. The personal interview requirement will be scheduled after this date, providing all documentation is completed by the end of February deadline.

Bachelor of Science in NURSING (in cooperation with UVIC)

Entry into this degree program requires that students be a Registered Nurse (RN). Cariboo College offers a three-year (6 semester) nursing program to become an RN. On achieving RN status in B.C., students may then apply for entry into the BSN degree program. This degree offers a part-time study option for working nurses, and a full-time, two-year study program. Some specific university level courses are required, and these may be completed before entry into the program. They include:

- Math 120
- Philosophy 331
- Psychology 333B
- Sociology 305 NOTE: Required prerequisite is Sociology 111/121 or equivalent.
- Elective 200 - One elective course (3 credits) at 200 level with UVIC transfer credit.
- Elective 300 - One elective course (3 credits) at 300 level or above with UVIC transfer credits
- Nursing 310
- Nursing 406

Bachelor of EDUCATION - Secondary

Entry into this degree program would require completion of a Bachelors Degree first. Students should enter and complete either an Arts, Science or Business degree program, meeting the course requirements of those degrees.

WE STRONGLY RECOMMEND TO anyone planning to complete a University degree program at Cariboo:

- 1) Make an appointment to plan your intended selection of courses in advance, and be sure that you understand all of the prerequisite requirements of lower level study.
- 2) Attend a FREE New Student Orientation session during the summer at the College to learn more about the campus and to ask important questions before the year begins.
