

As a follow up to our conversation yesterday, here are the details of books purchased or <u>being</u> purchased (some have not yet arrived) with the 500.00 donated to the Library by the Kamloops and District Committee for Higher Education:

- 1. Indian tribes of North America, a 3 volume set by Thomas L. McKenney and James Hall. Originally published in 1836, this is a reprint of the 1933 edition edited by the noted American Indian scholar, Frederick Webb Hodge. The publishers describe this as "without a doubt a classic and the first genuine anthropology." I consider this an outstanding addition to our already good collection of materials on North American Indians.
- 2. Sun: mankind's future source of energy, an expensive 3 volume set containing the most recent information on solar energy research. The Science department are apparently pleased with this acquisition on an important topic.
- 3. A series of 15 books from National Geographic, up to their usual high standard and covering such topics as European history, North American geography and wildlife, gypsies and nomadic tribes.
- 4. Two newly published books on African art we have little material in this area, and these will greatly enhance our collection.
- 5. <u>Muslim peoples</u>, a fine new resource book on the peoples of the Muslim world.

I hope this will give you enough information for at least a brief news item. I think, too, that the Kamloops and District Committee for Higher Education (and particularly Merle Matthews) should be pleased to have this recognition. Please let me know if you need additional information
