Kamloops and District Committee for Higher Education, a group active in the formation of Cariboo College nine years ago, has donated \$500 to the Cariboo College Library. Assistant Librarian, John Weller, noted that a number of books have already been purchased with the donation.

Students in the College's Physical and Life Sciences Department will benefit from the most recent research available on the important topic of solar energy which is contained in a three volume set entitled Sun: Mankind's Future Sources of Energy.

In addition, the Library has purchased <u>Indian Tribes of North America</u>, described by the publishers as "without a doubt a classic and the first genuine anthropology", which was originally published in 1836 and is a reprint of the 1933 edition edited by the noted American Indian scholar, Frederick Webb Hodge. It is considered an important addition to the Library's collection on North American Indians.

As well, a 15 volume series from National Geographic in their impressive style covering topics which include European History, North American Geography and Wildlife, Gypsies and Nomadic Tribes, has also been purchased with the donation.

The final selections are two reference books on African art and a new resource book called Muslim Peoples.
