The lengthy process of searching for a new Principal for Cariboo College is winding down according to Acting Principal and Vice-Principal (Administration), Leo Perra.

The search committee appointed by the College Board and consisting of representatives from faculty, support staff, departmental Chairpersons, administration and the Board, generated a "short list" of five candidates from the more than 100 applicants. The short list was finally approved by the Board on February 27 and the candidates have been invited to the College for interviews on March 19-20.

"The candidates will meet with representatives of all sectors of the College community," Perra stated. "This will provide an opportunity for those interested to meet the candidates while allowing them to get the flavour of the institution." On the following day the candidates will tour the campus and participate in individual interviews with the full College Board. Candidates will also be able to meet with representatives of individual interest groups within the College during this period.

"The Board has put a great deal of time and effort into the selection process, as has the search committee," Perra said. "I am confident that we will select the Principal who can do the best job for the citizens of the Cariboo College region."
