Visitors to the Cariboo College 10th Anniversary Open House on Saturday September 27 will be able to watch training in action in many of the College's 20 vocational programs, ranging from diesel engine tuneup to buffet preparation.

For example, the Food Training Centre in the Cafeteria building will feature students at work under supervision on decorating smorgasbord centrepieces, trimming cakes and producing canapes, all among displays of culinary specialties produced by the various classes.

Meanwhile, in the Mechanical Trades shop, visitors can watch such procedures as computer scope engine analysis, diesel testing and electrical system testing.

Films and slide shows will illustrate other aspects of these and other trades, with faculty and students on hand to answer visitors' questions.

Most of the College's 30 or so academic and career-technical courses will also be represented in demonstrations and displays.

The Open House, the first staged by the College since 1976, will take place from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. on the McGill Road campus.
