HIGH SCHOOL VISITATIONS TO CARIBOO COLLEGE

Most of the action took place in the new Science Building, but Cariboo region secondary school students---some 30 busloads of them---found their way to nearly every corner of the main Kamloops campus during the week of May 5 to "window-shop" a broad range of educational displays and demonstrations.

Each arriving delegation received a briefing from College counsellors, a "booster" button and a list of exhibits and activities to choose from. Then, singly or in small groups, they headed for whatever areas interested them.

College instructors and students were on hand in most areas to answer questions about courses and programs.

In the Science Building they witnessed Chemistry and Physics demonstrations, had an electrocardiogram taken, peered into microscopes, viewed rock samples, and learned about careers in Medical Laboratory and Respiratory Technologies as well as Nursing.

In the Main Building they obtained information about careers in Business Administration, Corrections and Community Health Service, and such academic fields as Languages, Geography, History and Fine Arts. Some of them dropped in on vocational classes which were in session in the various shops. Mag Card demonstrations interested many of those considering office careers.

The week's events, coordinated by Chief Counsellor Bill Daley, were part of the College's 10th Anniversary celebration. Fourteen secondary schools in the region took part.
