More than 900 students from 11 secondary schools in the South and Central Interior region are getting acquainted first-hand with the laboratories, classrooms, shops and other facilities of Cariboo College this week.

School bus traffic on the McGill Road campus is again heavy as the College stages a repeat of last year's successful visitations. This year the emphasis is on Grade 10 students, to help them in their career planning, although some older groups are included.

As they arrive on campus, each busload of students is given a brief orientation by a College counsellor and then a campus map and a list of demonstrations and displays in 17 different program areas, for use on self-guided tours. Those interested in shop facilities and programs will be taken on group tours in the Vocational wing.

The schedule for Monday, May 10, provided for groups from Merritt, Valleyview, Clearwater and 100 Mile House.

The Tuesday groups are from Lytton, Salmon Arm, Nicola Valley, 100 Mile House and Sahali (Kamloops).

The largest single school delegation, from MacArthur Park in Kamloops was scheduled for Wednesday, along with a smaller group from John Peterson Junior Secondary.
