Cariboo College's Communication Arts Department invites all educators to its second annual conference on Computers in the Language Arts Classroom, to be held Friday, February 13 and Saturday, February 14, 1987 at the College. The theme of this international conference is Changing the Ways We Communicate: Implications for the Learning Process.

The conference will appeal to all teachers of English and language arts. The hands-on workshop is designed for everyone from the novice to the experienced computer user.

Internationally recognized academic experts and representatives of major computer companies will share their knowledge through lectures, hands-on workshops, and equipment/software displays. Dr. Helen Schwartz of Oakland University will provide the keynote address, entitled "Combining Literature and Writing Through Computer Use". "The Hypermedia Approach" will be the subject of a lecture by Dr. Larry Friedlander of Stanford University. Dr. Betty Collis of the University of Victoria will discuss research on computers in the language arts, and Dr. Robert Arn and William Idsardi will provide information about an interactive writing program on the ICON computer. Dr. Patti Browne of the University of Alberta will address the question "Is There Life After Word Processing?" in the closing address.
