Aspects of small business management from bookkeeping to financial forecasting will be the subject of a series of all-day and half-day Saturday seminars scheduled between now and November 19.

The fall seminars, which are preceded by a workshop for bankruptcy and receivership creditors on September 12, are co-sponsored by the Continuing Education Division of Cariboo College and the Federal Business Development Bank. They will take place at the main campus on College Drive.

They begin on September 24 with an all-day (9 to 4:30) session dealing with bookkeeping functions. Paul R. Palmer, management services officer for the F.D.B.D., will lead all seminars.

Fees for the seminars are \$36 for the all-day sessions and \$20 for the halfday ones.
