The broad social trends of the last half-century, viewed in their relation to the massive technological development occurring at the same time, will be the subject of the next event in the current Cariboo College season of free public lectures, scheduled for Friday evening October 21.

The guest speaker in the second of the "Reflections: 1984" series will be Tony Williams, who chairs the Department of Anthropology-Sociology at Okanagan College in Kelowna. His announced subject is "Civilization or Barbarism: Trends and Changes in Society, 1934-1984."

Williams will speak in the College Board Room, beginning at 7:30 P.M. A question and discussion period will follow.

Williams' initial career was in the field of banking, first in his native London, England, and later in Vancouver. In 1965 he turned to an academic career, receiving an Honours B.A. degree and a Master's degree in Sociology at Simon Fraser University, along with teaching experience.

Other teaching duties at the college level in the Lower Mainland were followed by two years on the Cariboo College faculty and, in 1979, by his appointment as an instructor in sociology at Okanagan College.
