The well-attended free noontime lectures and films on aspects of modern English, Canadian and American literature will continue at Cariboo College until early April, according to Alastair Watt, chairman of Communication Arts.

On Wednesday (February 22), Dr. Watt will speak in the College Board Room on "The Novel", emphasizing how it differs from the short story in various respects.

The rest of the schedule is as follows:

Wednesday, February 29 - a National Film Board 53-minute motion picture, "Margaret Laurence, First Lady of Manawaka," dealing with the life and work of the noted Canadian writer, with excerpts from her works.

Wednesday, March 7 - Lecture by English Instructor Will Garrett-Petts on "What's So Canadian About Canadian Literature?"

Thursday, March 8 - A full-length (99 minutes) NFB film, "Volcano: An Inquiry Into the Life and Death of Malcolm Lowry." It includes readings by Richard Burton.

Wednesday, March 14 - Film, "Barn Burning", based on the short story by William Faulkner.

Wednesday, March 21 - Films about E. M. Forster, D. H. Lawrence and James Joyce.

Thursday, March 22 - Lecture by English Instructor Anne Molnar on "Women in Literature."

Wednesday, March 28 - Film, "The Rocking Horse Winner," based on a story by D. H. Lawrence.

Wednesday, April 4 - Film, "The Jilting of Granny Weatherall," based on a story by Katherine Anne Porter.

The lectures take place in the College Board Room and the film showings in Room 213-E. All events begin at 12:05 p.m.
