Visitor Parking

Starting next Monday (Oct. 5) the expanded visitor parking areas will be controlled by meters. The meter rate is 25¢ for the 30 minute period.

To meet expanded needs for short-term visitor parking, there are now a total of 16 spaces in three locations: the original visitor parking area in the traffic circle outside the main building; in the lot behind the Library, close to the cafeteria; and in the staff lot on the other side of the cafeteria, near the motorcycle parking areas.

Like regular parking lots, the meters are in effect from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. weekdays, and there's no charge on evenings, weekends or holidays. Courtesy parking permits are NOT valid in meter spaces.

Canada Scholarships

UCC has been granted five (5) new "Canada Scholarships in Technology" by the federal government, through their expansion in scholarships announced earlier this year. The original Canada Scholarship program offers \$2,000 per year (times 4 years) to students in science and technology degree programs. The expanded programs is for students in two and three year technology diploma pro-

grams across Canada. The awarding of five scholarships is a compliment to the strength of the technology programs at UCC.

Extra Support

Services for students with disabilities are being utilized more than ever at UCC, according to statistics from Counselling Services. There are 45 students now receiving extra support, a 100% increase over last year. They include students who are visually or hearing impaired, wheelchair bound, and learning disabled. Twenty-seven tutors, note-takers, attendants and interpreters are now involved in providing various support services, through coordinator Joyce Hickson in the Student Services centre.

Financial Aid
