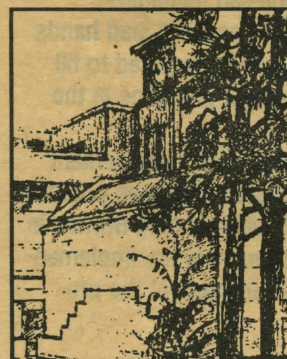

## Roadwork

Detailed design work is underway in preparation for tenders, and construction should begin in mid-June on changes to the existing "College Drive" entrance road to the campus.

The joint City of Kamloops/UCC project will move the current entrance west about 250 feet towards the Science Building and away from the traffic light. By moving farther from the McGill/Hillside Drive intersection, current traffic congestion should be reduced.

At the same time, UCC facilities staff are keeping their fingers crossed in anticipation of additional Ministry capital funding, to begin development of a new entrance road at the other end of campus this summer.

## Paving

At long last, Williams Lake campus students and staff can look forward to improved parking lot conditions. Tenders are expected to be called soon for the paving of the entrance road and major parking areas at the campus this summer.

It's expected the project will be an expansion of the original plans to pave one lot last fall, which was postponed after inadequate tender submissions.

## International Programs

Sandy Abraham from the Cariboo Management Centre has been busy facilitating programs in Borneo.

As part of the Leadership Development Program for Kaltim Prima Coal Co., 297 Indonesian managers, supervisors, foreman and lead hands are working on skills required to fill upper management positions in the company.

The response from management and the participants has been positive, and CMC staff will return to Borneo in late August to assist in the implementation of the final phase of the program.

## Capital Projects

The Ministry of Advanced Education has committed \$305 million for the construction of 'Capital' projects.

Among the first announcements on new projects are plans for an addition to the Arts and Education building at the Kamloops campus and an expansion to the Williams Lake campus.

Fraser Valley, Okanagan and Malaspina University College requests include expansions of facilities, UBC is planning to build a multidisciplinary centre for advanced materials science, SFU will design a consolidated student services building and all colleges across the province will receive funds for expansions.

Funding levels for individual facilities will be announced as project designs get underway.
