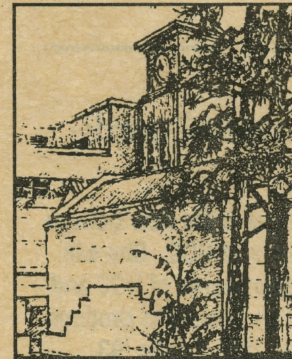

How Busy?

Every department has been more than busy this semester, but in the counselling department they have the numbers to illustrate the point.

Over the two month period of January - February 1992, Academic Advisors handled 1,096 student appointments, Counsellors saw 529 students on issues ranging from Career Counselling to personal crisis, and the department receptionist/secretary handled 3,150 telephone inquiries, and 1,273 general inquiries at the counter.

To help meet the overload of 'Summer Session' and the Registrations in June-July, the department is pleased to welcome former Open Learning Agency Advisor Charlene Munro (formerly Lorenz) on a temporary appointment. Many program chairs probably remember Charlene for the excellent work she did in liaising with UCC programs from her old OLA office at the KTEC location downtown. That office is now closed as OLA has reduced regional services.

Library Hours

Library hours will change slightly at the end of this month.

Regular hours will be maintained until the last day of exams, following which the Library will be closed for inventory from April 25 - May 1.

On another note, the Library can process copyright requests for faculty. A few weeks are required to obtain

- J&M Plastik Recycling Depot, at 1216 D Battle Street (across from I.C.B.C.), will gladly accept clean plastic jugs, containers and bottles.

Some examples include milk jugs, ice cream pails, juice jugs, softener bottles, detergent bottles, dish soap bottles, cottage cheese tubs, plastic hangers and lawn chairs, and acrylic.
