






History of Total FTE Utilization: 1990-2001







Fall-Winter Full-time Gender Distribution




Total Fall-Winter Gender Distribution




Part-time Age Distribution


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
Fall-Winter Part-time Gender Distribution






Fall-Winter Full-time Gender Distribution




Fall-Winter Part-time Gender Distribution




Total Fall-Winter Gender Distribution




Full-time Age Distribution






Fall-Winter Full-time Gender Distribution




Fall-Winter Part-time Gender Distribution




Total Fall-Winter Gender Distribution




Full-time Age Distribution






AGE DISTRIBUTION SEMESTERIZED VOCATIONAL




GENDER DISTRIBUTION SEMESTERIZED VOCATIONAL





FALL- WINTER GENDER DISTRIBUTION







New Admissions* of International Students




INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS 2000-2001

PERCENTAGE DISTRIBUTION BY **MAJOR PROGRAM AREA**



CO-OPERATIVE EDUCATION







