Founded in 1970 as Cariboo College, UCC today is a growing four-year undergraduate school offering a broad spectrum of education and training. GUESTS OF THE UNIVERSITY COLLEGE OF THE CARIBOO SHOULD FOLLOW THESE PROCEDURES TO SCHEDULE AN EVENT OR BOOK SPACE IN THE CAC:

- **1.** Contact the Events Coordinator (828-5005) to establish a suitable date and location in the facility, and request information about catering and space rentals.
- **2.** The Events Coordinator will assist in determining room set-ups, audio-visual requirements, catering needs and other details necessary for a successful event.
- **3.** Schedule an on-site meeting to tour the facilities and, if necessary, finalize a menu with the Food Services Manager and/or our Catering Chef.
- **4.** No later than noon, fourteen (14) days prior to the function, submit a deposit for fifty percent (50%) of the projected total cost of the function.
- **5.** Return a signed contract and a non-refundable deposit to the CAC Administrative office as soon as possible.
- **6.** A booking is not guaranteed until the signed contract and deposit are received.
- **7.** The CAC Events Coordinator will assist groups with accommodations and recreational activities in the Kamloops area.

UNIVERSITY COLLEGE STAFF:

UCC sponsored catered events follow the same procedure as events for guests, except a deposit is not required. A signed interdepartmental invoice for projected costs serves as the confirmation for the booking.

POLICIES:

NO SMOKING

In accordance with University College policy, the Campus Activity Centre is a completely non-smoking building.

USE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

Campus Activity Centre staff will strictly adhere to and enforce the UCC Alcohol Policy, and the British Columbia Liquor Control and Licensing Act.

Campus Activity Centre staff promote responsible management of events where alcoholic beverages are served. Our objective is to provide an atmosphere where alcohol is not the primary focus of an event.

Functions providing alcoholic beverages must also make available sufficient quantities of food and non-alcoholic beverages.
