KAMLOOPS, BRITISH COLUMBIA

Kamloops is a friendly, safe, smaller city in the interior of British Columbia. It is a 3 1/2 hour drive north-east of Vancouver. The region is famous for world-class down-hill and cross country skiing, fresh-water fishing, boating, hiking, camping, golfing, horseback riding and ranching.

The University College (UCC) of the Cariboo provides a beautiful campus setting with modern facilities for both study and leisure. UCC is a public degree-granting institution accredited by the Government of British Columbia.

4 WEEK INTENSIVE PROGRAM OVERVIEW

This 4-Week Intensive English program is designed for students who want to improve their communicative skills in English. It is also useful for students who want to improve their language skills prior to the fall academic semester.

Classroom instruction: The major emphasis in this program is placed on speaking, listening, pronunciation and vocabulary development. Reading and writing are also included depending on student levels and goals. Idiomatic language and colloquial, informal usage will be introduced.

Study Excursions: The objective of this aspect of the program is to provide students with an opportunity to use



the English they have learned in a natural setting. Students participate in recreational and cultural activities which are popular with Canadian students. In addition, they are able to see the sites of interest in Kamloops and the surrounding area.

Homestay: The objective of having students stay with Canadian families is to provide an opportunity for the students to speak English in the evening and on weekends. While living with a family, the students learn more about Canadian people and customs. Close lasting relationships often develop as a result of this experience.

Campus Residence: For students who do not select the homestay program, campus residence is also available. The residence is arranged in quads of four students who share a common central and washroom area. Each private room is equipped with a single bed, desk, chair, storage area and small kitchen facility. Meals are not provided. Space is subject to availability. Students should apply directly to McGill Student Housing.



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PROGRAM MODEL

Language Assessment

Language proficiency is assessed at the beginning and at the end of the program.

Welcoming Reception

On the first day of the program, students attend a welcoming reception where they are introduced to administrative, instructional and staff members.

Graduation Dinner

Students and their instructors are invited to a graduation dinner the evening before the last day of the program. This dinner is held at one of our local restaurants.

Farewell Ceremony

On the last day of the program, there is a farewell ceremony in which certificates are presented to students.

Certificate of Attendance

A Certificate of Attendance is issued to those students who successfully complete the course.

Instruction/Activities Schedule

Classroom hours: Classes are held three hours in the morning, Monday to Friday, and two hours in the afternoon two days a week.

Special activities: Cultural and recreational activities are organized for two afternoons a week. Occasionally an activity will be held in the evening rather than the afternoon period.

Friday afternoon: Students are free on Friday afternoons. This will provide the student with the time to explore the Kamloops area or to travel to places of interest in British Columbia. Kamloops is near to Vancouver, Banff National Park, Wells Grey National Park, and Shuswap Lake.

PROGRAM ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Students should have at least an upper beginner level of English.
- Students must be 17 years of age upon arrival on campus.

MEDICAL INSURANCE

Students must come with adequate medical insurance coverage. If a student does not have adequate coverage, it must be purchased prior to the first day of classes.

STUDENT AUTHORIZATION

For programs of less than three months, student authorization is not required.

- Submit an application form with your application fee of \$25.00 addressed to UCC International Admissions.
- Full fee payment must be received one month prior to the first day of classes for the stated program.
