

Learning a second language gives you a better understanding of your own language and culture.

Studying another language gives you a better knowledge of English grammar and enlarges your vocabulary. Reading skills are also transferable from one language to another.

Studies have shown that learning a second language enhances creativity.

If you intend to pursue your studies and attend graduate school, remember that a working knowledge of other languages is important for research and often required.

Many positions/jobs require second languages. The knowledge of a second or third language increases employment opportunities.

Language is a primary skill for modern language teaching, interpreting and translating. Many career programs now have a language requirement, as language is an auxiliary skill in business, industry, commerce, law, library science, media, service industry, travel and tourism.

When you travel, an ability to understand and speak the language of the region or country you are visiting will make travelling more enjoyable and more interesting.
