About the Program

UCC is the only educational institution in B.C. to offer a career program in Respiratory Therapy. It is a three year diploma program, fully accredited by the Canadian Medical Association. The program consists of two years (eight-month sessions from September to April each year) of theory and didactic study. This is followed by 47 weeks of comprehensive study and clinical internship at accredited hospitals in B.C.

As one of the most comprehensive programs in Canada, we use the first two years to provide theory that is relevant to the clinical practice. This allows our students to focus completely on theoretical application and clinical instruction for patient care in the third year. Our clinical site co-ordinators and clinical instructors guide students in putting theory into practice, which we believe is one reason that our students are consistently of the best in Canada.

The clinical year will be spent in at least three of the following hospitals in British Columbia, all staffed by UCC site coordinators and clinical instructors:

- Royal Inland Hospital, Kamloops
- Royal Columbian Hospital, New Westminster
- Vancouver General Hospital
- B.C. Children's Hospital, Vancouver
- St. Paul's Hospital, Vancouver
- Greater Victoria Hospital Society

The clinical internship requires spending time in the lower mainland and on Vancouver Island, and applicants must be prepared to relocate as required.

Admission to the Program

The statement of Admissions policy at UCC is found in the General Information section of the College calendar. It is important to note that all Canadian applicants are given equal status when applying. Since there are a limited number of places available in this program, applications should be submitted early. Once the program is filled, a student may be placed on a waiting list but cannot be guaranteed acceptance.

Minimum Educational Requirements:

- B.C. Grade 12 graduation (or equivalent) C+ average
- B.C. Algebra 12* (or equivalent), C+ minimum
- B.C. Chemistry 12* (or equivalent), C+ minimum
- B.C. Biology 12* (or equivalent), C+ minimum
- B.C. Physics 11 (or equivalent), C+ minimum
- B.C. English 12* (or equivalent), C minimum
 OR Level 3 on the Language Proficiency Index
 OR Completion of English 050

General Requirements

- 1. Successful medical
- 2. Complete immunization schedule
- 3. Interview with College counselor (optional)
- Mandatory hospital tour, form to be signed by a clinical site coordinator or the department head.
- 5. CPR Level C

^{*}These credits must normally have been obtained within five years of application.



The Role of the Respiratory Therapist

Respiratory Therapy is "an allied health discipline devoted to the scientific applications of therapy in order to assist in the diagnosis, treatment, and promotion of the well-being of patients with respiratory and associated disorders, from premature infants to the adults." This allied health discipline has been the natural evolution of an emerging need to care for a substantial group of patients with diverse respiratory problems.

Respiratory Therapy is an integral part of total patient care. Since the role of the Respiratory Therapist is continually being updated and redefined, Therapists must have a philosophy of flexibility. The expanding scope of the practice requires Therapists to be knowledgeable in therapeutics, diagnostics, technology, education, administration and research. Above all, Respiratory Therapists must be able to employ this highly specific technical knowledge with a human touch.

In their daily practices, Therapists may be actively involved in cardiac arrests or responsible for application, adjustment, and monitoring of lifesupport systems. Testing and evaluating new medical technology has become routine in many Respiratory Therapy departments. Transport of high-risk patients is another important role of the Respiratory Therapist.

With their technical and therapeutic expertise, Registered Respiratory Therapists may provide education services to other health care professionals, medical students, respiratory therapy students, the general public, to patients and their families.

With advanced education, more respiratory personnel now conduct and/or assist in cardio-pulmonary research.

Therapists are responsible for the selection, operation, and general maintenance of complex patient-care apparatus.

As medical professionals, they combine technical skills with scientific information to the **benefit** of their patients.



Respiratory Therapists are allied health care professionals who plan and implement a variety of therapeutic and diagnostic procedures for patients suffering from a wide range of heart and lung disorders.

The Registered Respiratory Therapist

An R.R.T. is a graduate of an accredited educational program who has successfully passed the Canadian Board for Respiratory Care examination in Respiratory Therapy.

Consistent with the standard of excellence established in the field by UCC, post-diploma programs have been developed for R.R.Ts.

Post Diploma Programs

1. Anaesthesia Technology

This program is for Respiratory Therapists currently functioning in this capacity or wishing to do so. It was developed co-operatively with Victoria General Hospital and Vancouver General Hospital and is offered on an independent study, tutor-supported basis, with the clinical portion generally completed at Victoria General Hospital.

2. Cardio Vascular Perfusion Technology

This program, for Respiratory Therapists or similarly qualified individuals, was developed cooperatively by UCC and Vancouver General Hospital. Graduates become skilled operators of extra corporeal equipment used to take over the patient's cardiopulmonary function during surgery. The didactic portion is offered on an independent-study, tutor supported basis, while the clinical portion must be completed at VGH.

3. Bachelor of Health Science

The B.H.Sc. (Resp) degree is designed to allow diploma therapists to engage in studies that combine advanced diploma courses with academic studies in Health Care Issues, Liberal Arts, and Social Sciences. Contact Larry Prins, Chairperson of Allied Health Programs.
