## Out with the Old

The UCC Library is busy this month, installing and learning how to operate a new Integrated Library System. When we all come back after the Holiday Break, the new System will be in place.

Comprised of various modules built on a library's core database of materials, the System will allow authorized users access to Library information from multiple points. Called CAROLIN by UCC Library staff, the new system is Unix-based, and connected to other university and college libraries in the BC College Consortium. Users will benefit from easier and better access to the UCC Library catalogue and databases, as well as external sources of information. Library users across campus and throughout the UCC region will have access to the windows-based System via the Web.

The first modules to be installed are the online catalogue, circulation, cataloguing of new books, and audio visual bookings. The acquisitions module and serials control will be added in mid-'98. Library staff underwent training for the new System in the first week of December. Workshops will be held in early '98 to orient UCC users.



#### **Student Awards**

At 4:00 pm on Thursday, November 27, over 400 UCC students convened in the Grand Hall of the Campus Activity Centre for the Annual Awards Ceremony.

Students met their benefactors and received scholarships, bursaries and other awards totalling over \$310,000.

Featured at the Ceremony was a special announcement by Roland Neave of a substantial estate bequest from his mother, Dr. Margaret Neave. Her bequest will be added to the Hugh Neave Memorial Endowment fund, which supports students in Geography.

Three new awards were dispersed for the first time this year. These included the Dr. G.B. Gowd Inc. awards, which support students who have completed their first year of studies in Science, the Ray Fuoco Memorial, in memory of Kamloops Freeman and community leader Ray Fuoco, awarded to a top business student, and the Don Campbell Memorial Endowment, awarded to a student in the Professional Cook Training program who demonstrates dedication, promise and commitment. Don Campbell was a well-loved member of the UCC community, and a highly respected instructor in the Professional Cook Training program.

Two special "Anniversary Awards," in celebration of the University Women's Club (UWC) of Kamloops' 40 years of community service and support, were also awarded at the Ceremony by members of the UWC. The club has sponsored many student awards since the UCC awards program began.

Student awards at UCC are made possible through active fundraising campaigns, volunteer effort and the generosity of community donors, coordinated by the UCC Foundation. The Foundation was established as a non-profit society in 1985 to enhance learning and education for students by raising funds for scholarships, bursaries and special needs.

#### **Sun Demons**

Final exams may come and go, but our UCC athletes just keep on running. Our men's volleyball team is 5 and 0 so far, ranked 6th in Canada, and the UCC men's basketball team is 5 and 2, ranked 15th nationally. UCC's women's basketball team is ranked 10th in the country, going 6 and 1 this season. Our men's basketball teams will play two universities during the Christmas break.

#### **Ed Council Update**

At their meeting of Wednesday, November 26, it was moved by Education Council that the amended Code of Ethics policy be sent out to the UCC community for Notice of Motion, to be voted on at the December meeting. A policy amendment to the Start of Classes policy, ED-13-0, was approved. A concern raised regarding a proposed policy on Honours, Majors, Minors and Concentrations, that the areas of specialization within the BA or BSc will not be listed on the diploma document, will be discussed further at the December meeting.

## ACHIEVEMENTS

#### From Kamloops to Kuala Lampur

Charles Mossop (International Ed), Richard Olesen (Professional Schools) and Jack Mathews (CSOM) travelled to the Loyal Institute of Technology--Academic in Kuala Lampur this Fall. The trip was part of a process to allow Loyal to offer the UCC CSOM program, which bridges to the UCC Bachelor of Technology in Applied Computing Science (BT/ACS) degree program. Students in Kuala Lampur will then have the opportunity to complete the UCC CSOM program, and then enter the work force or come to UCC to complete a BT/ACS degree.

A Memorandum of Understanding was signed by the two institutions, with provision for UCC to visit at a later date to accredit the Loyal CSOM program. One school in Hong Kong and two other schools in Kuala Lampur already have agreements with UCC to offer the CSOM program.

#### **Outstanding Innovator**

**Doug Baleshta** (Science) was just awarded the BC Science Council's Outstanding Innovation Award. Given to an individual who has researched and developed a technology novel to the region which is being applied to aid business or industry in the community, the award was bestowed on Doug for an innovative internet application for a forestry company.

Not one to rest on his laurels, Doug is off to Malaysia this week to teach an 8-day course on information technology at INPENS College.

#### **Mapping and Mentoring**

Five UCC students participated in a Recreation Enhancement project under the auspices of BC Parks and Kamloops Youth Resources Society during the past Fall. The project involved training in the forestry and range sector for youths aged 17 to 24 years. The young people, from differing sociological and educational backgrounds, worked under the direction of field technicians, a counsellor and a project manager.

The project included mapping 29000 ha of grassland in Lac Du Bois's Protected Area. Participants mapped trails, roads, fences, and noxious weeds, identified, mapped and removed debris, including abandoned cars, appliances, garbage and car parts, and collected seed and mapped desirable plant species for reclamation work.

1st-year BNRS students **Darcy Hill** and **Dara-Leigh Irving** participated as youth trainees, while 3rd-year Science student **Steve Hart** and recent BNRS grad **Marg Anderson** were field technicians and trainers. BNRS student **Connie LaRochelle** was Project Manager.

## **CSOM Outcomes**

Where have all the CSOM grads gone? Gone mostly to private business, according to recent statistics released by the UCC Co-operative & Career Education Dept. A follow-up of 1995/96 grads shows that 23 of 27 grads have obtained jobs in the private sector, with the others finding employment with the provincial government and a non-profit agency. A breakdown of positions in private business shows that the majority of jobs were found in software development, consulting, and corporate enterprises.
