

TWO + TWO = TOURISM DEGREE

Offered for the first time this fall, UCC's Bachelor of Tourism Management degree program will give graduates business skills and a wide knowledge base to assist the tourism industry to move into the next century.

Developed provincially, the degree is based on laddering from tourism diploma programs. It will also give credit for prior learning. This is what's called a "two + two" degree. Entry into this program follows graduation from a two-year diploma program in any of the UCC Tourism options, including Resort and Hotel Management, Events and Conventions Management, Tourism Management, Adventure Travel, or similar Diploma programs offered at other post-secondary institutions.

Prerequisites: Completion of a two-year Tourism Diploma at UCC or other post-secondary institution.

DIPLOMAS LADDER INTO BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE

Graduates of UCC's Respiratory Therapy Diploma program and the former Medical Laboratory Technology Diploma program may now count these programs as 60 credits toward a Bachelor of Science degree. Applicants are assessed on an individual basis, and, depending upon their major or concentration, will be required to complete an additional 63 to 66 credits of approved upper-level science courses. NEW BACHELOR OF ARTS REQUIREMENTS

UCC's BA degree is now fully independent, and thus has undergone some changes. These include an additional 3 credits in the category "Scientific and Formal Reasoning" for a total of 9 credits. In

addition to the old "Science Requirement" stand-bys of math, science or physical geography, students may elect to take Philosophy, Computing Science, or a statistics course in Psychology, Business or Sociology.

Another major change is in the language requirement. Students who complete a 2nd language to Grade 12 level in high school need not take any university-level 2nd language to qualify for the UCC BA.

Excellent written and oral communication skills are now high on the list of virtually every employer. The new UCC BA

recognizes this by requiring a 1st-year English requirement, plus another 100-200 level (6 credits) and a 300-400 level (6 credits) "writing intensive" requirement. Designated "writing intensive" courses are available in almost all disciplines, including Anthropology, Economics, Fine Arts, and others.

NEW GEOGRAPHY MAJOR

UCC has offered advanced Geography courses in Cultural, Historical, Urban and Environmental Geography since our BA programs began and now offers a Geography major program focused on Human Geography. All upper-level UCC Geography course offerings have been articulated with UBC. This is the first degree program in Human Geography to be offered outside the Lower Mainland.

Skills students will learn include geography research and analysis, good written and oral communication skills, and the means to adapt to new computer technologies in their profession. The program includes computer mapping, geographical methods and statistical analysis.

Students interested in such fields as urban planning, regional development, resource management, environmental design, economic geography, physical geography or secondary education, can now complete their undergraduate degree at UCC before entering graduate studies or the workplace. NEW COMPUTING DEGREE: 2+2

The UCC Bachelor of Technology in Applied Computing Science is a new, job-oriented, four-year degree program designed to prepare graduates for immediate employment in a business or industrial environment.

The first of its kind in BC, this practical, applied program teaches troubleshooting, database software, networks, windows and internet programming. Designed to accommodate multiple entry paths, students can complete two years of Arts or Science study before entering at 3rd year, or can complete a Computer Systems Diploma program first, then enter the degree at the 3rd year. The BT/ACS is a laddered (2+2) degree, and will involve the use of Prior Learning Assessment and the application of "knowledge units" in the evaluation of a transferring student's academic record and field experience.

Prerequisites:

BC Grade 12 or equivalent with a C+ average; BC Math 12 or equivalent with a C+ average; 67% on the combined English 12 and Government Exam within the last five years or equivalent; Computing 12 or equivalent or instructor's permission; knowledge of a micro-computer operating environment, and ability to use a text editor.

Candidates for the BTACS can complete a two-year diploma in Computer Systems: Operations and Management, or the first two years of a general Bachelor of Science or Arts degree with at least four Computing Science courses and Calculus I and Calculus II, English, and Statistics.

BACHELOR OF JOURNALISM DEGREE

UCC's Bachelor of Journalism Degree program is being developed by a committee of industry advisors who will also play a large role in developing the curriculum, as well as advising on and providing opportunities for a practicum component in the program. Previous experience and the opportunity to ladder in other education will be important parts of the degree, which is expected to also have a strong liberal arts component. The program will be offered beginning September/98, subject to budget approvals.

WE'LL BE SEEING YOU!

Academic Advisors' main role is to help students to determine exactly what courses they need to take in order to qualify for a degree, diploma or certificate. They provide students with current, accurate information about educational programs, transferability and prerequisites, with emphasis on current and accurate. Anyone who has been in the field of secondary-post-secondary education for any time knows that requirements change, often from year to year, and up-to-date information is a must. Advisors also help students with course selection, planning and timetabling.

Part of the UCC Liaison Team, Advisors play a key role in the overall high school visitation program. Throughout the course of a school year, UCC Advisors will visit a school three times. In the Fall, the Liaison Team tries to give students a general sense of what to expect! In this first visit, presentations to students focus on what UCC is all about, UCC's programs, how to apply, and the costs.

"It's important for prospective university college students to understand what they're getting into," explains UCC Advisor Bernie Crawford. "We want them to come when they're ready, not because other people say they should. They have to take what they are interested in. And we always reassure them that it's okay for them to change their career goals." Students are also advised to talk to friends, family, and employers, and discuss their goals with teachers, both at their high school and at UCC.
