
### Hockey Grads Win Scholarship

In September, two former Cariboo College Hockey Chiefs will be going to Michigan Technological University in Houghton, Michigan, on hockey scholarships.

Rob Cederberg, two-time Canadian Colleges Athletic Association All-Canadian and Cariboo's 1986 Male Athlete of the Year, and Jamie Russell, 1985 Cariboo Chiefs' Most Improved Player, were scouted at the recent National College Championships in Kamloops.

Coach Terry Bangen is happy to see his players receive deserving recognition and, to his knowledge, this is the first instance of Canadian junior college hockey players transferring to a U.S. college hockey team.

Coach Bangen says, "It is very rewarding and I'm sure Jamie and Rob will do themselves, Cariboo and Kamloops proud". Both athletes were Cariboo College Sports Task Force award winners.

### President's Report

On July 25, President Charles Brewster and eight other representatives from universities and institutes in B.C. left on a three-week trade mission to Indonesia, Malaysia, Singapore and Thailand.

This tour is sponsored by the Ministries of International Trade, Science and Post-Secondary Education and its purpose is to look into possibilities of providing technical assistance to these Pacific Rim countries as well to recruit overseas students.

### College Budget Update

Funding for 1986/87 has been received in a fragmentary fashion over the period April through June.

Our "base budget" has been supplemented by a total of \$1,086,900 from the Province's \$110 million "Excellence in Education" fund.

Since the "base budget" for 1986/87 was significantly less than that in 1985/86, however, this does not represent a \$1 million increase in funding!

Some of the "excellence" funding has increased our general operating fund; other monies have been for specific purposes as follows:

\$ 80,000 for the Cariboo Business Development

Centre,

\$158,000 for the installation of "energy management" equipment on the Kamloops campus, \$200,000 towards the establishment of an

Automated Design and Graphics Centre associated with the CADD program,

\$101,300 for general equipment upgrading.
As well, Cariboo stands to receive a portion of \$2 million which is available to the College system for computing equipment.

Consistent with the Ministry's goal of increasing the availability of mainframe computers within the College system, this money will probably provide us with a new VAX 8500, allowing one of our 750s to move to a college presently without a central system.

The most recent funding bulletin from the Ministry, on July 8, announced:

\$225,000 for renovations to the Cafeteria, and \$75,000 for general repairs and maintenance.

This was followed by the news that the province's Expo Legacy Fund would be providing \$500,000 to the Cariboo College Foundation to be used for the Playing Fields project. I'll be updating you on the Playing Fields project in the next issue of the "Communicator".

Brochures containing more information are available from secretaries in the Faculty Offices.


At the same time, Athletic Director, Pat O'Brien, reminds everyone of the College Gymnasium's facilities and the excellent value of the Gym Passes.

### Fall Registration

 Registration will take place August 18 - 29, according to student number. 100 - 150 students are expected to register during each of the scheduled times.

• Wait-lists will be kept for closed sections by the Counsellor in the Boardroom. These lists will be kept as a demand indicator only, with students being advised to contact the appropriate chairperson during the first week of class about vacancies. Students will not be phoned if a new section should open. Wait-lists will be reviewed when new sections are opened. These wait-lists will be sent to appropriate chairpersons on the afternoon of Friday, August 29.

• There will be a need for an advisor to be available from the English and Business Departments during the registration hours, beginning at 09:15.-For students registering during August 18 - 29, it would be useful if chairpersons were available in their offices for any enquiries.

 A Section Enrollment Report will be available at the end of each day.

 During the first day of classes (Tuesday, September 2) the Records staff will continue to register students into sections, where space allows, without the instructor's signature.
 Beginning Wednesday, September 3, a student will be registered into any section only with approval from the instructor, chairperson or director.

The Records Office will not register students in excess of the

original capacities approved by the various educational directors unless a student has a signed "Add" form.
