KAMLOOPS—A private college in Beijing has chosen The University College of the Cariboo as one of its stops during a secondary and post secondary school tour across Canada.

Representatives from Beijing Concord College Sino-Canada arrive in Kamloops for an overnight visit Jan. 29 and 30, where they will spend an evening at Sun Peaks then head to UCC the following day for lunch with President Roger Barnsley and a campus tour.

The group's visit is the result of a contact made by Cyndi McLeod, Executive Director for UCC International, during a recent trip to China for school visitations.

The delegation includes three administrators, four teachers and 34 students as well as seven members of the Beijing television and print media.
