KAMLOOPS—Considering a career in health care fields such as physiotherapy or pharmacy? UCC's Rural Pre Health Program hosts two lectures in January that will focus on requirements for entering the fields and experiences in the professions.

On Jan. 9, UCC alumni and local physiotherapist Tammy Ueda will discuss how she chose her profession and reflect on a typical day at work. She will talk about holding a Master's degree in her field and explain the difference between an occupational therapist and a physiotherapist.
