FORESTRY'S AFFECT ON B.C. WILDLIFE — WHAT SOME LITTLE BIRDS WILL TELL YOU

KAMLOOPS—Dr. Tom Dickinson, Associate Professor of Biology at UCC, will discuss findings from a decade of study into the effects of alternative forestry practices on a community of songbirds that breed in an experimental forest near Sicamous.

The study of songbird surveys has given some unique insights into how elevation ecosystems operate and which songbird species are most susceptible to the silvicultural alternatives that are employed there, said Dickinson.

The study suggests meaningful interpretations of ecological processes require consistent monitoring over the long term, something that is rarely done in applied research. Dickinson will speak Oct. 4, from noon to 1 p.m. in the Science Building, Room S373.
